Introduction:

The Vermont Children's Trust Fund was established in 1986 for the purpose of providing funds for community-based primary prevention programs. A tax check off account was established in 1996, enabling Vermonters to donate to the Children's Trust Fund when filing their Vermont state tax return. The Vermont Children's Trust Foundation has been contributing private dollars to and managing the fund since 2009. In 2022, pursuant to Sec. 8. 32 V.S.A. § 5862b, the Vermont Children's Trust Fund was repealed and the tax check off dollars are now sent directly to the Vermont Children's Trust Foundation for the purpose of providing funds for community-based primary prevention programs for children aged 0-18 throughout Vermont.

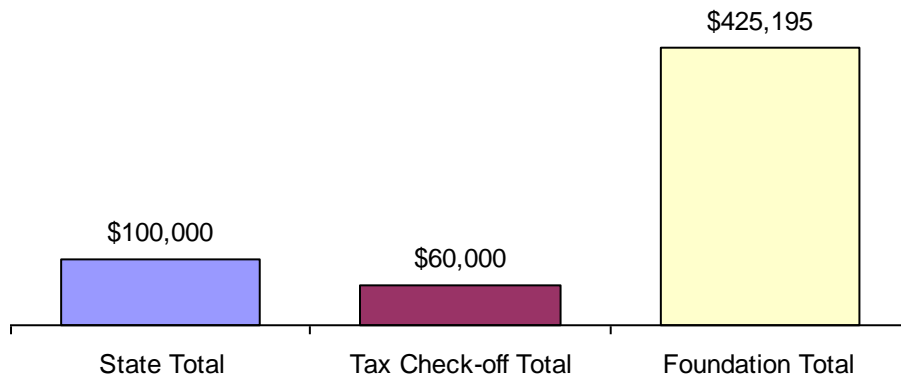

Vermont Children's Trust Foundation Grants Cycle and Process:

The VCTF grant cycle starts in early January with an open invitation to community organizations to submit proposals for funding. Technical assistance trainings are provided as necessary.

Grant review is conducted by a team of volunteer readers from diverse backgrounds in early May. Funding recommendations are made by this committee to fund a slate of programming. Grants approved receive funding beginning in September. VCTF coordinates performance measure and financial reporting from grantees on a semiannual basis.

A VCTF staff member conducts a site visit to each grantee during the grant period.
