EARLY EXPERIENCES MATTER

VCTF supports the Winooski Family Center's Early Literacy Program, which encourages parents to engage their young children with books, music and other literacy activities.





WITH SIGNIFICANT EVIDENCE that points to parent involvement as one of the key factors linked to school readiness, the Early Literacy Program at the WFC was designed to support parents and caregivers in creating enriching early reading experiences for the entire family with a focus on children from birth to five-years-old.

Parents in the Early Literacy Program are instructed in ways to easily incorporate books, music and other literacy based activities into their daily interactions with their children. In weekly meetings, families are encouraged to read aloud, share stories and play creatively together. Local library trips help parents discover developmentally appropriate materials for their preschool children.

Through these group activities, children and parents are introduced to new friends, many of whom will share a future Kindergarten experience. Socializing with other families builds community connections that benefit both parents and children for the many school years ahead.

One of the parents in the program sums up the importance of this program beautifully, "This playgroup helps me talk to other parents, learn English, get information, and helps my son learn."



TURNING TEARS INTO PEARLS

How one teacher made a significant difference in the lives of local children.



"Mrs. Jed kneels down and puts her arms around this child, smiles and whispers comforting words."

Mrs. Jed (Patsy), a beloved teacher who ran Creative Playgroup Preschool in Colchester, was just such a person in her community:

"In a room alive with twelve preschool children playing, creating, discovering, laughing...one child is crying. Mrs. Jed kneels down and puts her arms around this child, smiles and whispers comforting words. And then the magic happens: Mrs. Jed reaches in her pocket, takes out a tiny silver spoon and rests it on the child's cheek, scooping up a tear. She puts the spoon in her pocket and after a second brings her hand out and opens her palm for the child. To the delight of the child, the tear has transformed into a magical pearl. The child is astonished that Mrs. Jed has the power to turn sadness into precious, magical pearls. Mrs. Jed puts the pearl in a tiny jar, tightens the lid and hands it to the child to take home as a treasure."

Sadly, Mrs. Jed passed away recently from cancer. As with all strong and dedicated teachers, her spirit carries on in the young lives she touched.
